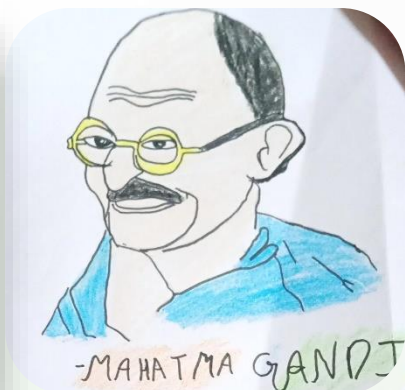


This day is observed across the world to give the message of non-violence. Gandhi has been an inspiration for non-violent movements across the globe.

'JAI JAWAN JAI KISAN' LAL BAHADUR SHASTRI

Lal Bahadur Shastri was an Indian statesman who served as the second Prime Minister of India. He promoted the White Revolution – a national campaign to increase the production and supply of milk – by supporting the Amul milk co-operative of Anand, Gujarat and creating the National Dairy Development Board. He was born to Sharada Prasad Srivastava and Ramdulari Devi in Mughalsarai on 2 October 1904.



Deepanshi of class VII B highlighted the importance of this day through a speech in the morning assembly. She added that 'Jai Jawan Jai Kisan', the slogan of Lal Bahadur Shastri, is etched in our minds as it captures the true spirit of India. Lal Bahadur Shastri's public life has left an indelible mark on the country. He was unique in the way he connected with the common man.

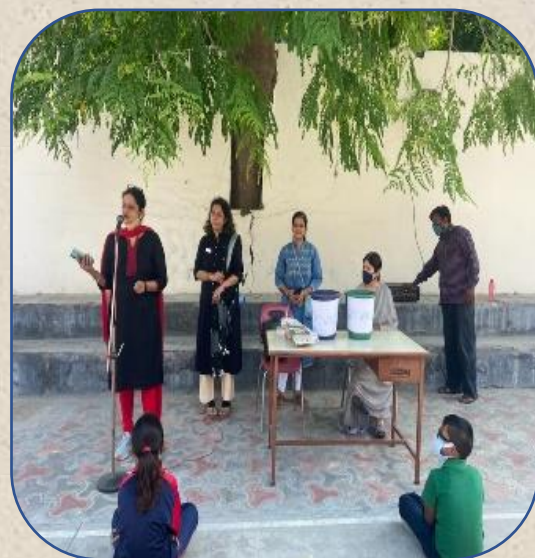

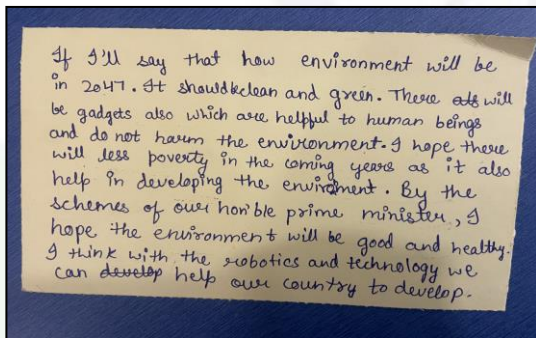
AZADI KA AMRIT MAHOTSAV
