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






# **VACCINATION CAMP (9.1.2022)**

Around 150 students of our school were vaccinated in this camp.

# **COMPETENCY BASED EDUCATION TRAINING BY BRITISH COUNCIL (17.1.2022-24.1.2022)**






# TEACHER TRAINING SESSION BY EXTRA MARKS (27.1.2022)






This course is divided into three levels, i.e.:

- CPT (Common Proficiency Test)
- IPCC (Integrated Professional Competence Course)
- FC (Final course)

Students need to clear a previous level to take up the next level. CA is one of the most sought-after career options after Class XII for commerce students. The overall difficulty of this course is very high and therefore it might take some students multiple attempts to clear a level. It is among the most paid career choice in the field of commerce.

Various other options such as Marketing, Finance, Human Resources, Accounting, or Business Administration were also discussed during the seminar. The tips were also given to students that before entering the courses, they should research more on the eligibility, salary trends, and jobs available. Feedback forms were also shared at the end of the seminar and all the queries of the students were resolved.

In order to enlighten the students about career planning a session on career counselling was organised by the school. In this session, Ms Pooja Vohra (Spokesperson) discussed how to plan the journey from classroom to college and career.

The one hour session began with the meaning of Career Planning which involves mapping the key steps of a professional future. It helps to choose a career, get job stability and financial security. One can make a plan by following the steps mentioned below:

- Identify your strong areas
- Understand how your skills, values and talent can be used to choose your career paths
- Match your skills with job and career
- Match your career objectives with financial needs
- Identify if you need to attain higher education or professional certifications
- Match your career objectives with educational needs

Apart from career planning, Ms Pooja also enlightened the students about the Hero Fin Corp Career and College Guidance Program which support students to take life decisions. She also encouraged the students to take an assessment on MYSAARTHI.ORG portal which has the following features:

- 560+ Careers (English, Hindi & 8 other languages)
- 1200 scholarships
- 1150 entrance exams
- 25k colleges and vocational institutes spanning over 3 lakh courses

This session guided the students through the dilemma of choosing a right career and helped them in deciding what should be done further and what prerequisites are required for that.

Ms. Poonam Gulati's presentation was followed by the presentation of Ms. Amrita Sharma Class Teacher of






- 1. For the students of VIII Tangrams activity was conducted. It is a simple set of geometric shapes made up of triangles.

The enthusiasm of the students was laudable. It was planned in a way to enhance their mathematical skills and explore their creative side.








